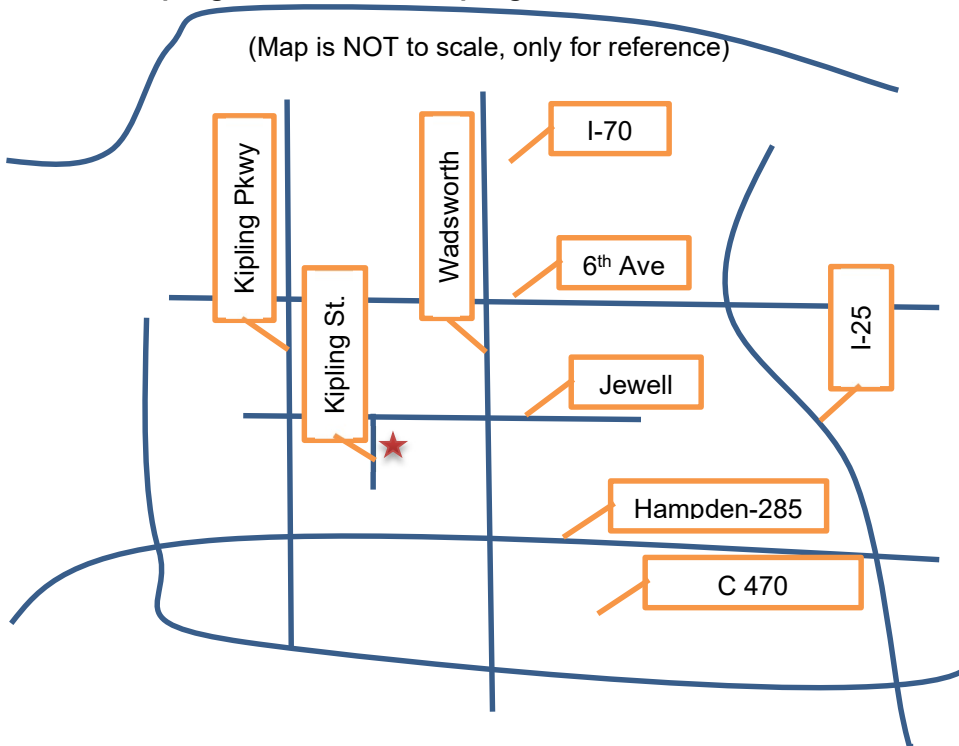
**North Denver/Colorado Area**

- I-25 South to 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue exit 209B West (US 6) West for 16 miles
- Take Kipling Parkway Exit (CO-391) heading South for 3.2 miles
- Turn Left at light onto West Jewell Avenue for 0.6 miles
- Turn Right at light onto Kipling Street for 0.1 miles
- Use first or third entrance to parking areas (Middle entrance is student loading)

**South Denver/Colorado Area**

- I-25 North to Exit 201 for Hampden (US 285) Turn left heading west for 10.2 miles
- Exit for Kipling Parkway (CO 391) turning right heading north for 2.0 miles

**Each day is split into three time blocks (9am – 11am; 11am – 1pm, 1pm - 3pm) • and limited to roughly 25 dogs each. This is to help reduce the amount of time you need to be at the event. The 9-11 block fills up first! You must arrive and check in within the first hour of your assigned time block. Dogs not checked in by 2 PM will be scratched and no refunds will be given.**

**\*\*Day Of' entries will ONLY be taken if the tests have not filled\*\***

Entries will be recognized when they are received – NOT by post mark  
 ALL communication with the Secretary must be by EMAIL (not text or phone) this way everything is documented

**Exhibitors should follow veterinarian's recommendations to assure their dogs are free of internal & external parasites, any communicable diseases & have appropriate vaccinations.**

Running order will be in the general order you check in for each time block.  
 Volunteers that have dogs entered will have priority to run first for each block to allow them to be available to help others.

## **Ribbons/Awards**

A light blue participation ribbon will be awarded to each dog that completes the 100-yard run. Light blue rosettes for dogs that earn a new title!!

## **ELIGIBLE DOGS**

Fast CAT events are open to all dogs at least 12 months of age that are individually registered with the AKC, recorded in the Foundation Stock Service (FSS) program, individually registered with a foreign or domestic registry organization whose pedigrees are acceptable for AKC registration, dogs granted a Purebred Alternative Listing (PAL) number, dogs with AKC Limited or Conditional Registration, or dogs enrolled in the AKC Canine Partners program. Dogs with breed disqualifications and monorchid/cryptorchid dogs are eligible to participate. Females in season may not participate

## **RMHA Fast CAT Test Rules and information**

### **ALL DOGS RUN AT OWNERS SOLE RISK**

- All entries must be 12 months of age or older on the day of the test.
- Dogs will NOT be required to wear muzzles, but if one is used the dog must be able to open it's mouth and pant freely and be free of any hard or sharp edges.
- White and/or black plastic bags will be used for the lure.
- Dogs that are overweight and/or out of condition may be at greater risk for injury and exhaustion. The Inspection Committee has the authority to disallow a dog's entry into a test for lack of condition, and in such instances, applicable entry fees will be refunded.
- All AKC Rules regarding sportsmanship and conduct apply.
- This is a rain-or-shine outdoor event. Please plan accordingly.
- Please bring your own shade/rain cover, chairs and water.
- Electronic timing system will be used. Manual stopwatches will be secondary.
- An electric, continuous loop lure machine will be used with plastic strips.
- Port-a-pot will be on site
- Dogs must be on lead or crated unless running.
- A \$5 fine/per dog per occurrence will be assessed for any loose dog on the field not competing or for not picking up after your dog.
- You are responsible for controlling your dog(s) and children.
- Each dog requires an individual entry form for one or both events in which it is entered per day. Entries will not be accepted without fees, signatures, or the "Agreement" found on the Official AKC Entry Form.
- Bitches in season and lame dogs will be excused. Entry fees will be refunded.
- The Starter/Huntmaster is responsible for field safety and therefore he/she is in complete charge of all dogs and handlers on the field. In service to this responsibility, he/she has the authority to stop the lure in any potentially dangerous situation and signal the handler to retrieve a testing dog.
- Dogs should be warmed up before and cooled down after running.
- Dogs entered in 2 tests on the same day will be inspected before each run.
- Two wading pools of water will be available, if needed due to the high temperature – wet down your dog before AND after to keep your dog cool!
- No choke, prong or training collars while running. Tags must be taped flat. See page 9 for information about collars.

No entry fees will be refunded if the event cannot be started or completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, extreme and/or dangerous weather conditions, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, strikes or any other cause beyond the control of the Club or its members and representatives.

### ABOUT FAST CAT

Fast CAT is a timed straight 100-yard dash for dogs.

Dogs are held at the start line and the coursing lure is activated prompting the dog to follow chasing it to the finish line and into a catch pen. The course is completely fenced and dogs are run individually.

- A. The dog's time to complete the 100 yard dash is converted into MPHs using the formula below, rounded to the nearest hundredth of a mile:

$$204.545 / \text{Dog's Time} = \text{MPH}$$

Example: The dog's time is 8.14 seconds.  
 $204.54 / 8.14 = 25.13 \text{ MPH}$

- B. A handicap system is applied to a dog's MPH to determine the number of points earned. The handicap system is based on the height of the dog at its withers:
- 18" or greater = handicap is 1.0.
  - 12" up to less than 18" = handicap is 1.5.
  - Below 12" = handicap is 2.0.
- C. Points = MPH multiplied by the dog's handicap

Titles are earned at specific point levels and the highest suffix may appear after the dog's name:

- BCAT = 150 points
- DCAT = 500 points
- FCAT = 1,000 points
- FCAT# = Each additional 500 points

**Top 20 by Breed by Year:** The AKC Fast CAT website will feature the Top 20 Fastest Dogs by Breed by Year national standings. The standings will be updated as event results are processed.

### Entering & Procedures

RMHA is running TWO TESTS per day concurrently, with four tests over the weekend: Test #1 and #2 are on Saturday with Test #3 and Test #4 on Sunday. We are also breaking up the day into three time blocks: 9am–11am; 11am – 1am; 1am – 3pm. You must arrive and check in within the first hour of your assigned time block. The tests and time block you prefer to enter **MUST BE SPECIFIED ON YOUR ENTRY FORM**. We will fill blocks with roughly 25 dogs based on the order I receive entries (not post mark). Additionally, your dog's height at the withers **MUST BE ON THE FORM**. There is one form for Saturday, and one for Sunday.

- 1- Use the correct form for Saturday or Sunday
- 2- Circle the time block at the top you prefer (Good idea to list an alt block)
- 3- Circle the Event number for each test or both to enter both tests for that day
- 4- Include your Dog's height at the withers with the other required information on the entry
- 5- Mail your entries with a check or scan and email to the secretary (ktjdsb@gmail.com) and pay via PayPal (use rmhounds@gmail.com for payments). See page 2 for PayPal fee structure.
- 6- If you have questions, contact the Secretary.

You must check in at the "CHECK IN" table within the first hour of your time block. Once you check in, you will be given your card(s) for each test for your dogs running that day. Life happens – if you are unable to make your time block, you can come later in the day and we will try to work you in, but no later than 2 pm.

You will need to approach the "INSPECTION" area with the dog and the collar they will wear while running and present ONE of your cards. Once your dog passes inspection, for soundness, bitches in season and appropriate collar type a stamp will be placed on your card. *If your dog is determined to be lame during the inspection, a refund will be given.* You will then approach the Secretary where they will put your dog's name on the "BOARD" for the running order. When your dog's name is reached, The Huntmaster will call the dog where you will present your stamped card for verification. You may start your dog anywhere up to 10 feet behind the starting line. The lure will be placed in approximately the same starting position for all dogs. Your dog will then blaze a trail down the 100-yard track!

If you entered a second test for that day, you need to return to the "INSPECTION" table and get your 2<sup>nd</sup> card stamped after your dog has been inspected again. Get the dog's name on the "BOARD" and your dog will blaze a second trail! The "INSPECTION" table will have all ribbons.

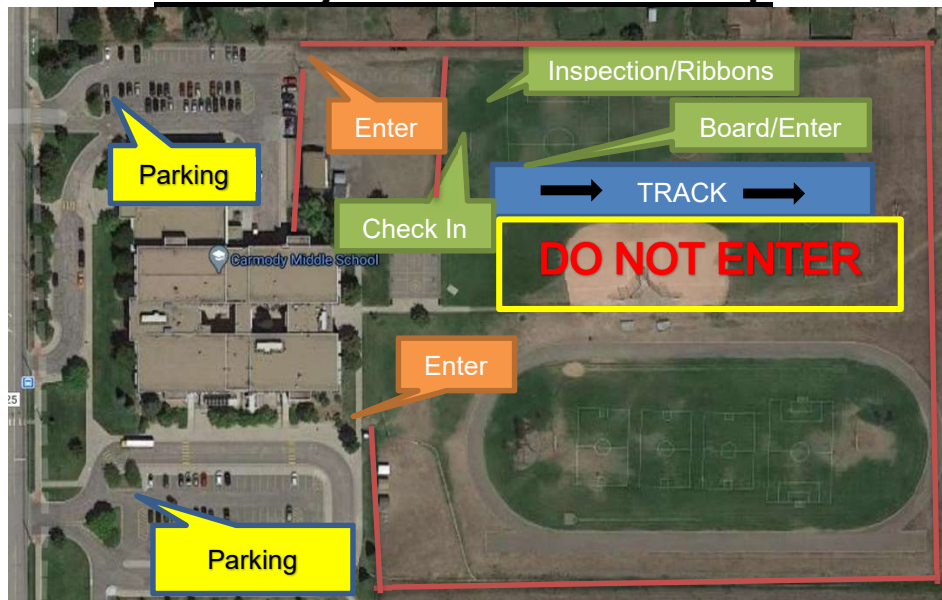

## Collars - Handlers

The following are the rules for AKC regarding Collars and handlers and will be strictly followed

SECTION 13. COLLARS/PARAPHERNALIA. Dogs may wear any type of collar except choker collars, a collar with prongs or an electronic training collar. The collar should be snug to minimize the chances of catching on something during the run. Clubs may, at their option, require that tags hanging from the collar be taped up. Owners may have their dog wear a muzzle if they desire. Owners may use clips or rubber bands to hold the dog's hair. The owner assumes responsibility for the safety of the dog with regard to the dog's collar and paraphernalia on the dog. Head halters, such as the Gentle Leader or Halti, may be used on the grounds but must not be worn while running the course. (RMHA requires tags to be taped).

Section 14. CONDUCT OF THE HANDLERS. Handlers are not permitted to run down the 100-yard course with a dog during its run. If the course is fenced, this includes both inside or outside the fence. Handlers shall simply release the dog in the starting box and may not run with the dog within the starting box. Handlers may run within the catchment area as their dog is running the course but may not cross the finish line. Cheering, clapping, calling your dog's name, whistling and waving your arms from the end of the course or the start area is allowed. Noise making devices such as whistles, duck calls, electronic calls or other items of this nature are not permitted. The use of toys, treats, flags or other items of this nature are not permitted while the dog is running the 100-yard course, however they may be used after the dog has crossed the finish line to assist in catching the dog. Should a situation arise where the application of this Regulation is open for interpretation, the event committee shall decide how it will be handled. An explanation shall be submitted to the AKC along with the event results.
